A Message from Vivian: New Center Opening

Dear friends of ENLC,

As we start off the new year with gratitude for our many achievements in 2021, we also realize there is so much more to be done! With that in mind, our board and staff have been considering the opening of a new Women's Center. After much research, we have decided on the western part of Cincinnati, specifically zip code 45211, where the abortion numbers are very high. The number of abortions last year in this one zip code totaled 155, the highest in all of southwest Ohio. We hope to collaborate with all of the Cincinnati pregnancy centers to make this new location successful as we have done with our other centers. The need is there; the services are not there yet.

The theme of our capital campaign is, "The Least of These." Beginning this spring, we hope to raise the \$250,000 needed to sustain the first two years of operations. One of Mother Teresa's favorite texts in the Bible was, "Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me" (Matthew 25:40, 45, NIV). The true "least" of the brothers and sisters of Jesus are those persons who are most profoundly vulnerable. They are the socially, psychologically, or economically disadvantaged such as the sick, the poor, the mentally and physically disabled, or, in our case, the unborn. "Abortion," said Mother Teresa, "...brings a people to

be spiritually poor, and that is the worst poverty and the most difficult to overcome."

ENLC's Women's Centers are full-service pregnancy centers offering a wide variety of support services. Some highlights of these services include pregnancy testing, pregnancy consultations, ultrasounds, a token economy system involving individual and group classes as well as "baby bucks" for completing them, Baby Boutiques, maternal and paternal mentoring and support, and post-abortion healing. Holy Family Prenatal Care, located in Dayton, offers full prenatal care and a variety of parenting classes. Finally, our Marriage Works! Ohio department offers marriage and relationship classes in schools, in our Women's Centers, and at the Marriage Works! Ohio building. Examples of relationship classes include Go for the Gold, Lasting Intimacy, Discovering Our Deepest Desire, and Building a Eucharistic Marriage.

How Can You Help?

First of all, pray for the success of this new venture and that this new center will find favor in the eyes of God as we strive to expand our ministry to the "least of these." Secondly, you can donate by going to our website, sending in a check, or designating funds from your IRA. Please consider a onetime donation or a monthly or vearly pledge to help us open our ninth Women's Center in this very needy area of western Cincinnati. We were able to secure a matching grant of \$25,000, which means that every dollar you contribute, up to \$25,000, will be matched dollar for dollar.

Last year we were able to save 2,150 babies from abortion through our 8 Women's Centers. Please join us in this campaign and help us raise that number by opening a new center in a high-need area!



As a member of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood, I'm impelled to preach the truth that all life is precious, as precious as the Blood of Christ. We are excited to announce the launch of the *Building a Eucharistic Marriage* online video series! Developed by the Director of Marriage Works! Ohio, Greg Schutte, MSW, LISW-S, this Catholic marriage enrichment course is designed to encourage and equip couples not only to deepen their marital relationship, but also to strengthen their relationship with Christ in the Eucharist.

The Content

The 7-session video series, made possible through a generous donor, was filmed and produced in partnership with Blackstone Films and Revive Parishes, Inc. Growing out of Greg's first program, Discovering Our Deepest Desire, the Building a Eucharistic Marriage series juxtaposes seven habits for building a healthy and thriving marital relationship with seven habits for entering into a richer relationship with Christ through the Eucharist. Assisted by his wife, Stephanie, as well as Father Alex McCullough, Greg unfolds God's vision for marriage and teaches practical

skills for achieving this vision such as how to make time for one another, ways of implementing ongoing selfevaluation, and tools for good communication and conflict resolution.

Greg has been a therapist for nearly 30 years and has passionately promoted healthy, Godly marriages for over 15 years through couples therapy as well as classes for secular, Christian, and Catholic audiences. Although he has taught the Discovering Our Deepest Desire and its Christian counterpart, Renewing Our Love, throughout the southwest Ohio region, he is excited to offer the *Building a Eucharistic Marriage* online

Recently, I met a young woman who was sitting on the curb at the abortion clinic looking rather distraught and I asked her if she had had an abortion and if she wanted to talk. She indicated that she had not had the abortion yet and that she was waiting for her mother to pick her up. The sidewalk educators who are on the sidewalk everyday had already spoken to her and she was not saying much, but she did give us her name. We offered to take her across the street to the Women's Center but she refused.

I returned to the car and began praying again for her and all the young expectant mothers who go into this abortion clinic every day and end the lives of their little ones. A particular scripture and description from the 40 Days of Life prayer book jumped off the page at me and I approached the girl again and read the scripture passage to her as well as the description. She listened, but was still not willing to talk to me.

As I looked around at the signs, the one for the Abortion Pill Reversal Hotline caught my attention and I pulled it out of the ground and returned to the young woman and offered the APR hotline number to her. I did not see her put it in her phone so I assumed she was tuning me out at that point. Shortly after that attempt an abortion

worker took the girl into her own car and drove away. That was a Thursday, my regular day to pray at the clinic.

The following Monday that young woman appeared in one of our Women's Centers. She had returned the next day (Friday) to the abortion clinic and this time took the first abortion pill but quickly regretted it and did not take the second pill 24 hours later as instructed by the abortion clinic.

As she told our consultant: "I didn't want to take the pill but the abortion clinic worker insisted that I take it there and I don't like to say NO to people so I took it." Once she left the clinic she felt that she had done the wrong thing and remembered that someone had offered her information on Abortion Pill Reversal and she found the hotline number on-line and called. They took her history and referred her to our Women's Center for an ultrasound to be sure the baby was still alive, which she was. Her mother was with her and they immediately went upstairs to our prenatal clinic where our doctor started her on the progesterone regiment to stop the effects of the first abortion pill. She is now happily carrying the baby to term and things are working out very well in her life.


